Definition of honesty:
Speaking the truth and acting truthfully

You can be honest by

- Telling the truth about something you have done, even if you might get into trouble.
- Explaining how something really happened.
- Admitting to yourself that you have done something wrong.

8 very good reasons for telling the truth

1. Everyone knows what really happened.
2. People who have done nothing wrong are not blamed.
3. When you lie you get into more trouble than if you are honest.
4. Everyone can learn from what happened.
5. One lie, often leads to more lies.
6. Others trust you more when you tell the truth.
7. People admire honesty.
8. Telling the truth helps you feel peaceful inside.
