### Your ticket to play is a loose part!

Every student is asked to bring in **1 item for play** to the **OPAL playday** to help build our collection of loose parts for the OPAL Primary Programme.

Here are some examples of loose parts that your child could bring in:

- Large cardboard boxes
- Old car or bike tyres (washed)
- Large empty spools (used for wire, chain, rope, etc)
- Large buckets and containers
- Wood scraps
- Thick rope
- Plastic pipes, tubes, or hoses
- Old kitchen utensils, baskets, pots, and pans
- Tarps
- Fabric scraps (the bigger the better!)
- Milk crates
- Crutches
- Nets
- Old wagons, and buggies
